

FROM THE PEN OF THE PASTOR:

The LORD is in his holy temple; let all the earth be silent before Him.—Hab. 2:20

God is ever breaking into our world to bring the gift of his salvation to us. Where does this happen? It happens in the worship service when God is in his temple. This is why the Israelites approached the temple with reverence. It is why we need to come before the LORD in this same reverence as we come to worship.

When I was a little kid, my grandmother was the lady at church who always set up the trays for communion. When she was setting up for the Lord's Supper, she always took me in tow. As she carried the trays to the front and placed them on the altar, she always approached the altar area with such reverence. I asked her why she was so quiet when she did this. "This is God's house, and he is here," was her answer. She bowed before the altar. For her, she was bowing before God. How can you not bow before the Lord of heaven and earth? Church was a holy place where you acted differently, even if you were alone setting up communion and nobody else was watching. Well, one was watching, God. She was ever aware of that.

One of the sad things that has happened in our world is that so many people no longer hold anything to be sacred. It has been disastrous for our world. People today do not fear the LORD. They sin so easily, as if God does not exist. As the people of God, we need to be different. We are commanded to fear the LORD, and this reverence must be evident in our lives. We need to teach our children to fear the LORD. Where does this begin? In God's temple, the church.

As the prophet Habakkuk considered the LORD in his temple, he wrote, "Let all the earth be silent before Him." What does he mean by this? Well, it is kind of like being in a courtroom. When the judge walks in, all voices hush. All focus turns to the business at hand, the trial. The matter is far too important for anything else to be even mentioned. How much more the worship service! The Judge of all mankind, the LORD of heaven and earth, is present. A trial to determine life and death is taking place as all is taking place, one that will determine eternal life and death. The Word of God is being shared, which is God's own judgment on sin. The Word of God is shared, which is God's judgment for those who repent, "Hear my judgment, your sins are forgiven, and you are freed from death." What should happen to all earthly conversations in this house as we come to his house? "Let all the earth be silent."

Does this mean that we should not be talking at all? No. Obviously, we are called to sing praises to God. We, in fact, are called to be witnesses in this place and tell the world of God's judgments. However, what should cease is thinking about earthly things. God calls upon us to focus our minds on the heavenly things. God is present. Here is where we begin to practice reverence for the LORD. This is where we let the world know we "fear the LORD." This is what we need to teach our children. If we and our children do not learn this within the house of God, do we really think that we and our children are going to walk out the doors of the church and live a life of holy reverence for our holy God?

What an amazing God of grace we have; he allows us as sinners to come into his presence. What a God of love we have that he is so ready to forgive and heal us. This love should lead us to revere him as the Holy God that he is as we look at what had to be done to secure our forgiveness, the death of his Son. This love should never be used as an excuse to wink at sin and not fear our God merely. As we come to worship, let us revere our God. Let us teach our children to do the same. Let the world walk into our midst as they come to visit and see how we respect our mighty Savior whom we call our Lord. If this country can stop in silence as soon as politicians and judges enter a room, should we not all the more ponder the heavenly in God's sanctuary? As we come to worship, let us pray. Let us worship our God and lead our children to join with us. Let us encourage the person next to us by our example to set his mind to the LORD who is in his temple.

#### "More Than A Negative"

Even if you've never had to testify in court, a thousand TV shows have made you familiar with the question, "Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?" Why not just make people swear to tell the truth? Or make them promise not to lie?

Any parent who has ever had to interrogate a child about a broken cookie jar or a scuffle over a toy knows the answer. There are plenty of ways to try to get out of trouble without technically lying. You tell just enough of the truth to skate on by.

We often play the game of seeing how close we can get to sinning without technically going over the line.

But in our heart of hearts we know that this is not what God intended when He gave us the commandments. He's not giving us a merely negative rule and challenging us to just barely stay away from this or that. There is much more to each commandment than a prohibition. We shouldn't just avoid murdering people - we should be of service to our neighbor.

For each negative prohibition in the commandments there is a positive good that we are to cherish and protect. In the Eighth Commandment, that gift is the reputation of our neighbor and our relationship with him:

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

Your relationship with your family members (who are your nearest neighbors), the other members of your congregation, your coworkers and your friends is one of the most precious gifts you have been given. You need to exercise good stewardship with this gift just as much as you need to exercise good stewardship with your life, resources, time and income. This is an especially fragile gift because it's easy to ruin a relationship with slander and talking behind someone's back.

But speaking well of your neighbor in Christian love is absolutely free; it costs you nothing, yet it pays you great dividends. If you find this challenging at times, if you are tempted to speak ill of others, just remember that this other person is also a beloved child of God for whom your Lord Jesus suffered and died. Your Lord Jesus loves you both.




**Congratulations to recent Chapel Whopper Winner**, Callie, 5th grade, for working extra hard in class to improve her grades over the past several weeks.
