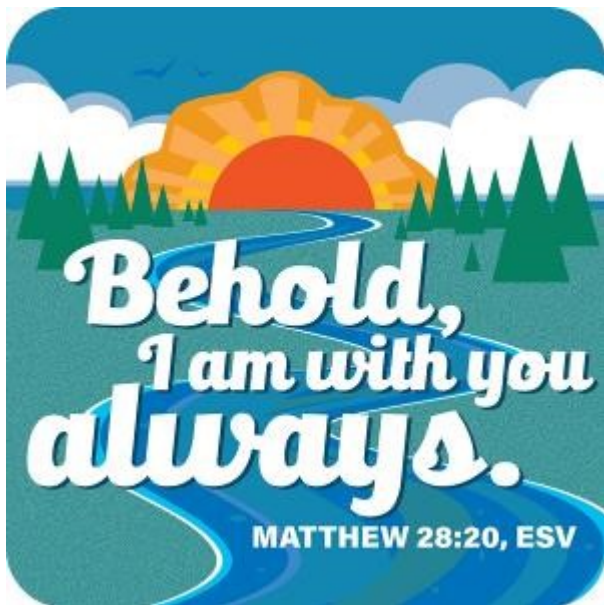

FROM THE PEN OF THE PASTOR:

*“Easter, Jesus Risen,
But Where Is Jesus Now?”*

based on Matthew 28:18-20



If only we could see and touch Jesus like the disciples did that first Easter night in the upper room if only we could see Jesus like Mary Magdalene and the others who visited the tomb that first Easter morning. What a lift that would be!

It is easy to see why you may want this. Like the disciples, we face a world that can be very cruel. They were locked in that upper room out of fear. Have you been afraid of things you are facing? Like Mary, we can feel so alone. Like Thomas, we can feel like the Lord has abandoned us. What Christian does not want to experience a closer walk with the Lord?

Easter brought Jesus to the disciples back then. The big surprise is that it also brings Jesus to us

today. Each of the Gospels sets before the church the gift of the ever-present resurrected Christ who comes to be with us. Matthew makes it the clearest. Where do you find the resurrected Lord? "I am with you always." But where? "Teach and baptize, and I will be right there!" We meet Jesus each time we teach His Word. Jesus touches us and remains with us through our baptism. This is the fact: Those with the eyes of faith will see Jesus right there.

However, that is the problem. In our weak faith, we do not always look to find Jesus when we are around his Word. Sadly, most see Bible study as an intellectual exercise. It can be a little different than attending a science lecture. We do not always understand that Jesus is waiting right here whenever we discuss his Word. Instead, parents and kids alike say, "Well, I have heard that story at school before." You are missing the point. It is a chance to be with Jesus in an extraordinary way where he comes in his grace to bring us forgiveness and life with him. When we in faith grasp this truth, we are led to run to Jesus, to behold him in all his love, and to hear his comforting words of mercy. We listen to the voice of our Shepherd, who is not dead but very much alive and with us.

Have you made excuses in the past to not hear his Word? Don't you want to see Jesus? Run to him. You need him as much as I do. We all need him. Run to him. Run into the arms of Jesus. Run to his Word. There you will see him just as he told you. While you are running, bring the kids along, too.

The totals from the commitments will be used for planning Ministries for our Boards to carry out during the coming year. The more commitments we receive, the more accurate our budget planning will be.

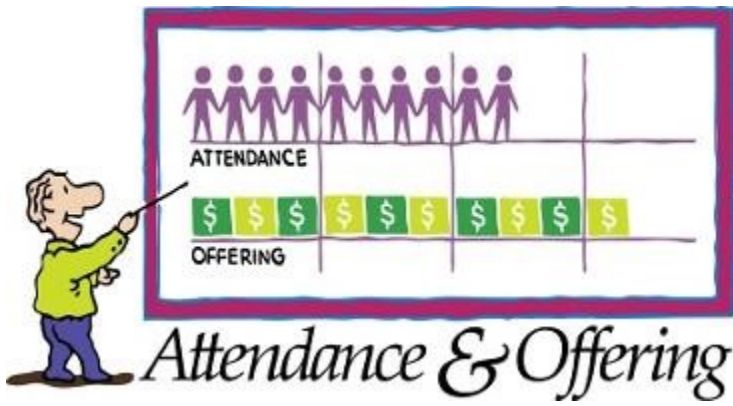

“Whose Is It Anyway?”

If you have ever bought or sold a house, you are acquainted with the concept of a “title search.” Before you can sell your house, and before anyone else will feel comfortable putting down the money to buy it, you have to prove that you really own it. So a title company looks through the public records to ensure that you bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it from the person who really owned it before that, all the way back to the earliest records of your state, including when your state was only a territory or colony of England.

Peak into a preschool classroom during playtime and you’ll see a simplified version of this. A child starts playing with a ball, but another child says, “That’s mine: I had it first.”

You can’t understand the Seventh Commandment without understanding this concept of ownership or title. As the Small Catechism puts it:

You shall not steal. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor’s money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

Your neighbor’s possessions are his: you don’t have a right to take them. And likewise, your possessions are yours. Ownership and property rights are foundational to any functioning society.

But there is something deeper to know about ownership, and that is the question of who has the title and ownership to you? Paul says, “Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price” (1 Cor. 6:19–20).

If you yourself are owned by God, then of course everything that you own, you really only possess by God’s leave: all of it, at bottom, belongs to Him since you belong to Him. For you were bought with the blood of Christ.

This notion is the foundation of all Christian stewardship. It all belongs to God. It should all be used for things that bring honor to His name, blessings to our neighbors and the extension of His kingdom.

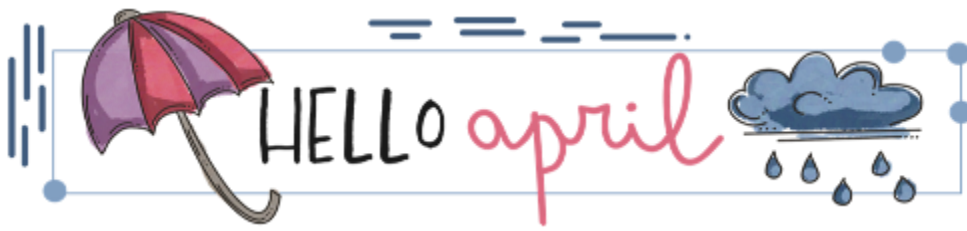

GRACE PLACE- Saturdays @ 5 pm
